
Johannes Hamhaber works as Professor for Regional Management at the Institute for Technology and Resources Management in the Tropics and Subtropics at TH Köln since March 2008. As a human geographer, he has specialized in urban sustainability and the sociology and governance of natural resources. With extensive international experience in teaching, he is a leading partner in the curricular development of an interdisciplinary, global master program on Resource Efficient Cities (IMaREC) in a consortium with



universities from Egypt, Indonesia, Mexico, and Kenya; and in projects on digital teaching and learning.

He addresses cities as socio-ecological systems from combined metabolist, complex system and governance perspectives, in his research connecting social sciences and urban water, on e.g. urban water and resilience, water smart city, planning blue-green infrastructures, in own work and regular supervision.
